The Center for Research in Anthropology (CRIA), opens a call for the award of one (1) Research Grant within the scope of the project *Porto in Times of Cholera and War: A bioarchaeological approach to human fragility (BeFRAIL)*, funded by national funds through FCT/MCTES (PIDDAC), with the reference 2022.02398.PTDC: https://doi.org/10.54499/2022.02398.PTDC.

The BeFRAIL project, with Francisca Alves Cardoso (CRIA, NOVA-FCSH) as Principal Investigator and Nicholas Marquez-Grant (Cranfield University) as Co-Principal Investigator, focuses on the study of health and disease inferred through the study of an archaeological context and associated collection. The context refers to the hospital cemetery of the Ordem 3ª de Nossa Senhora do Carmo, in Porto (Portugal), whose occupation covers the years 1801 to 1869: years of cholera and war in Portugal. The BeFRAIL project has as its core the archaeological and bioanthropological analysis of the context and associated collections using a multimethodological and multidisciplinary approach (e.g., archaeology, bioanthropology, history, demography, archaeothanatology and archaeosciences).

Scientific Area: Archaeology, Anthropology, History and related areas

General Admission requirements

Candidates must:

- 1) Hold a Bachelor's in Anthropology, Archaeology or other areas related to the work program:
- 2) Be enrolled in a Master's, Integrated Master's or in courses that do not confer an academic degree (in accordance with Article 6 of the Regulation for Research Grants of the Foundation for Science and Technology, I.P. [Regulamento de Bolsas de Investigação da Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia, I.P. in place) may also apply.

Specific Admission requirements

Candidates must:

- 1) be experience in the study, design and identification of ceramic materials from archaeological contexts;
- 2) be proficiency in reading and advanced knowledge of writing in English;
- 3) possess knowledge of Microsoft Office (or equivalent) and Mendeley (or equivalent), as well as cloud-based storage services and collaborating online tools (e.g., Google Drive, Dropbox, etc.).

Work plan:

The selected candidate will perform tasks associated with the BeFRAIL research project in close collaboration with the project PI and team members. The work plan includes:

- participation in work meetings and training related to the work to be developed;
- Identification and curation of archaeological material (e.g. ceramics, beads, etc.) related to the BeFRAIL project;
- photographic documentation of the elements under study, and drawing of the most relevant elements;
- inclusion of information in a database and data curation;



• participation in the production of outputs based on the work developed.

Workplace and scientific supervision:

The workplace is located at LABOH - Laboratório de Antropologia Biológica e Osteologia Humana (LABOH), a CRIA laboratory located at NOVA FCSH, Av. de Berna 26C, Lisbon, and/or other locations necessary for the development of research activities, under the scientific supervision of Francisca Alves Cardoso.

Duration of the grant:

The grant is for a period of 3 months, non-renewable, and is scheduled to start on January 2, 2025.

Applicable legislation and regulations:

Activity Regime:

The grant does not generate or entitle a legal-employment relationship and is exercised on an exclusive dedication basis, in accordance with the Statute of the Research Fellow.

Value of the monthly maintenance allowance:

The monthly amount corresponds to €990.98, as per Annex I - Table of monthly maintenance allowances of the Regulation of Research Fellowships [Regulamento de Bolsas de Investigação] of the FCT in place. The value of the allowance is increased by personal accident insurance. The scholarship will be paid monthly, via bank transfer.

Selection methods:

The evaluation of applications will be based on the following criteria:

- 1) Evaluation of the Curriculum Vitae (40%), taking into account:
 - Academic background: including a breakdown of grades obtained in the subjects of the respective course and final grade (if applicable), or other certificate of an academic nature;
 - b. Reference to training courses/activities/participation in projects/others (proven via certificates/declaration/other) relevant to the work to be developed;
 - c. Experience in work/areas relevant to the work to be developed;
- 2) Evaluation of the Motivation Letter (40%), taking into account:
 - a. Reasons for applying to in the position;
 - b. Reason why the candidate should be selected;
 - c. Demonstration having undertaken activities related to the work to be developed
 - d. Expectations regarding inclusion in this research project.
- 3) Proposal of methodological approach (maximum 500 words), based on experience (20%).

The criteria will be scored on a scale of 0 to 100. The candidate's Final Score (CF) will be obtained by calculating the Weighted Average of the criteria. In the event of a tie, the CV score will prevail.



The jury reserves the right not to award a scholarship if no candidate matches the desired profile.

All candidates will be notified of the results via e-mail.

Application and formalization deadline:

The competition is open from November 7 to 21, 2024.

Applications must be submitted on the CRIA website, at https://cria.org.pt/pt/emprego-e-bolsas, in Portuguese or English, accompanied by the following documentation:

- Motivation letter (including name, place and time of birth, reason for interest and reason for selection);
- Curriculum Vitae;
- Certificate(s) of qualifications, including breakdown of grades obtained in the subjects of the respective course and final grade (if applicable);
- Proof of enrollment in a bachelor's, master's or other degree
- Proposal of methodological approach (maximum 500 words).

Applications submitted by other means will not be considered. Candidates who formalize their application incorrectly or who do not prove the required requirements will be excluded from admission to the competition. The jury has the right to require any candidate, in case of doubt, to present supporting documents for their statements.

*Academic degrees obtained abroad require recognition by a Portuguese Institution in accordance with Decree-Law no. 66/2018, of August 16, and Order no. 33/2019, of January 25.
